SILVER SPRING, MD – Montgomery County Planning Board Chairman Derick P. Berlage today announced the availability of the latest online information on development in Clarksburg, Maryland, Montgomery County’s newest planned community, at www.clarksburgplanning.org.

With so many plans for residential and commercial projects proposed, under review, approved or under construction, this new website will provide timely information for residents and business people in Clarksburg and throughout Montgomery County. In addition, the Clarksburg Master Plan is available for download on this site.

“Our planners and technology staff members are advancing our openness and access to the public with this new Clarksburg Planning web site,” said Berlage. “This is one of our many ways to increase transparency at M-NCPPC, and it follows in the footsteps of our successful Silver Spring web site.”

Clarksburg is the last in Montgomery County’s chain of “corridor cities” planned along Wisconsin Avenue to I-270 north. Beginning at Friendship Heights at the Washington, DC line, the corridor continues through Chevy Chase, Bethesda, Rockville, Gaithersburg, Germantown and then Clarksburg, near the Frederick County line. The 1994 Clarksburg Master Plan features a town center, including the Clarksburg Historic District, a transit- and pedestrian-oriented community surrounded by open space, a greenway network and employment along the I-270 Corridor.
