**32 MONTGOMERY COUNTY PARKS RENOVATED SINCE 2004**

**SILVER SPRING, MD** – Montgomery County Parks’ acting superintendent Gordon Rosenthal today announced the completion of 32 playground renovations in the past two years, with several additional playgrounds currently under reconstruction.

During 2004 and 2005, playgrounds renovated in Montgomery County parks included the following, several of which were funded by donations, grants and cost sharing plans:
