

Mark Harris Baseball Facility, Manassas, Va.

An 18,200 square foot \$ 1.3 million baseball and softball facility with a 26 foot high wall. The ceiling peak height is 50 feet, a video room. (see attachment # 8)

Champions Baseball Academy, Louisville, KY.

A year-round 40,000 square foot facility with a 16,000 foot open area, a 30 foot high ceiling, 8 coin operated batting cages, a baseball card shop, sporting goods store. (see attachment # 9)

Triple Crown Baseball Facility, Chesapeake, Va.

A 12,000 square foot facility with coin operated batting tunnels, pitching mounds, and a 70 foot by 20 foot corridor for fielding. (see attachment # 10)

Four Seasons Baseball, Inc., South Portland, Maine

A 7,100 square foot facility with 4 pitching mounds (which convert to softball use, 2 pitcher's mounds, retractable netted batting cages which can be used for an infield practice area, and video critiques of player's styles. (see attachment # 11)

Renz Baseball, Lilburn, Ga.

A facility containing batting cages, radar guns to evaluate ball speed, hitting stations, pitching mounds, pitching machines, and video training analysis. (see attachment # 12)

Slammers, Lakewood Colorado

A facility equipped with both baseball and softball training stations, 7 pitch hitting stations, a clay filled pitching mound, audio/video training equipment, a sporting goods store, team and association meeting rooms, and basketball courts. (see attachment # 13)
