

GARDEN FEATURES

Anderson Pavilion

The small garden surrounding the Pavilion features sweet-scented climbing roses and fragrant flowering shrubs.

Aquatic Garden

A naturalistic setting for water and moisture-loving plants.

Azalea Garden

In a seven-acre woodland, over 400 varieties of azaleas and rhododendron bloom April through June. Shade-loving bulbs, groundcovers, perennials, shrubs, trees, and vines complement the azaleas.

Conservatories

Year-round, lush tropical plants frame seasonal floral displays.

Formal Gardens

A series of three gardens linked by a flagstone path:

Perennial Garden: colorful perennials suited for the Washington area bloom spring through autumn;

Yew Garden: seasonal displays highlight spring bulbs, summer annuals and perennials, and autumn chrysanthemums, surrounded by a clipped yew hedge;

Maple Terrace: Japanese maples, many miniature spring-flowering bulbs, and a summer-flowering groundcover encircle an intimate sitting area.

Fragrance Garden:

Fragrant herbs, shrubs, vines and bubbling fountains stimulate the senses.

Gude Garden:

A tranquil nine-acre garden of sculpted pods and rolling hills features mature specimen trees and the Japanese Tea House.

Rose Garden

Shaded pergolas offer a view of the best rose varieties interplanted with perennials and ornamental grasses.

Trial Garden

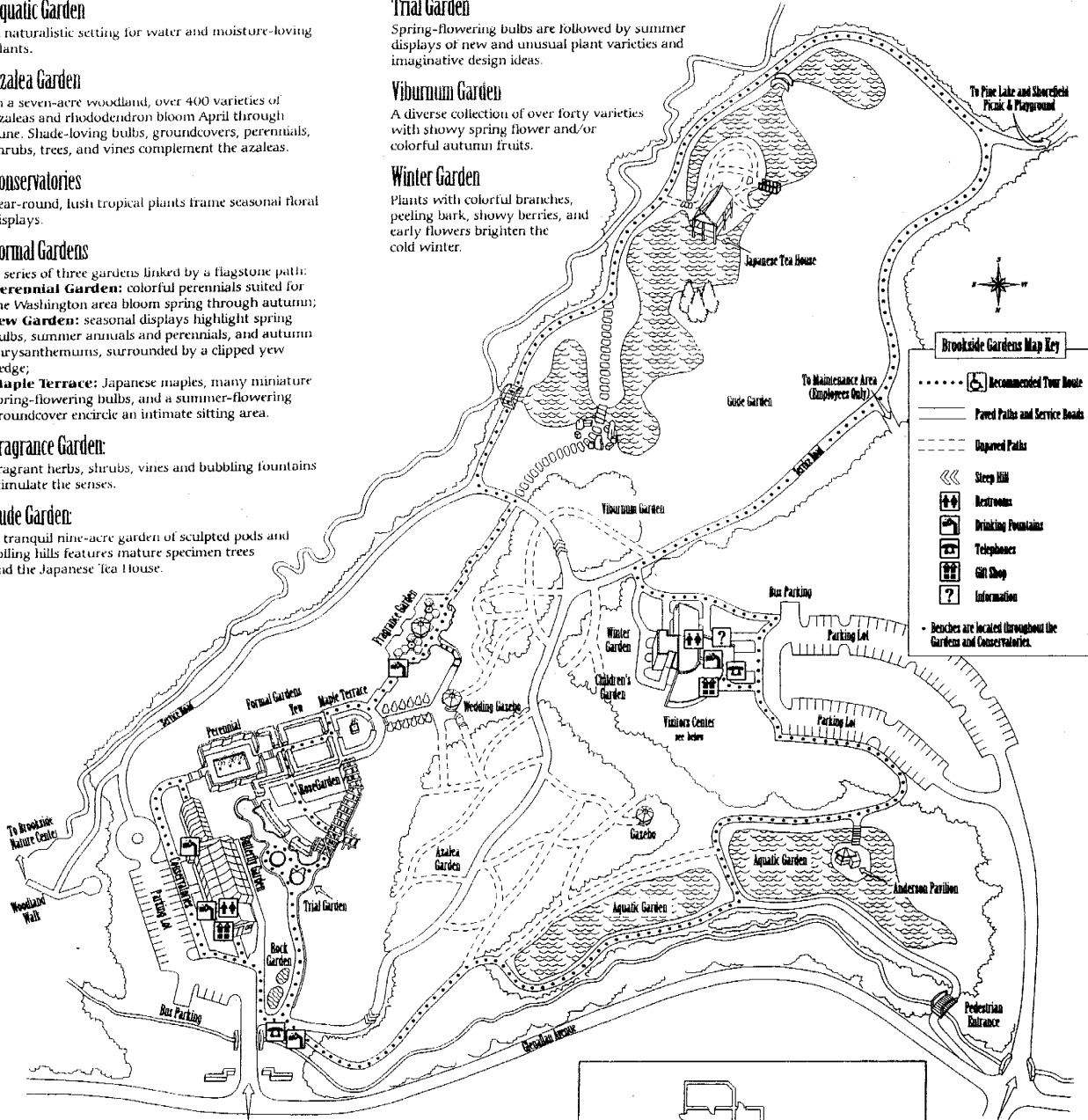
Spring-flowering bulbs are followed by summer displays of new and unusual plant varieties and imaginative design ideas.

Viburnum Garden

A diverse collection of over forty varieties with showy spring flower and/or colorful autumn fruits.

Winter Garden

Plants with colorful branches, peeling bark, showy berries, and early flowers brighten the cold winter.
