SUBJECT:

<u>Introduction</u> – Zoning Text Amendment 05-15, building coverage and impervious

surface limits.

The report of the interagency working group on the environmental impacts of private institutional facilities in the rural and large lot residential zones was recently released. The working group concluded that large private institutional facilities in the zones examined raise important environmental concerns that need to be addressed.

ZTA 05-15 is one of several measures proposed by the working group to address the environmental issues. Under the ZTA, building coverage and impervious surface limits would be placed on the development of private institutional facilities in the rural and large lot residential zones. Any existing development not in conformity with the proposed limits would be grandfathered. Any future expansion of a grandfathered private institutional facility would be subject to the building coverage and impervious surface limits in effect when the expansion occurs.

A public hearing on ZTA 05-15 is scheduled for November 8, 2005. The advertisement will be broad enough to allow other zoning options considered by the working group to be adopted.

# AN AMENDMENT to the Montgomery County Zoning Ordinance for the purpose of:

establishing a definition for the term "impervious surface";

revising building coverage standards as a percentage of net lot area for certain zones;

establishing maximum impervious surface standards as a percentage of net lot area for certain zones;

requiring the submission of a site layout design under certain circumstances;

grandfathering certain lots from building coverage and impervious standards under certain circumstances; and

generally amending building coverage and impervious surface standards.

By amending the following section of the Montgomery County Zoning Ordinance, Chapter 59 of the Montgomery County Code:

The site layout design must demonstrate compliance with the maximum impervious surface standard under 59-C-1.32. Any lot with a building converge greater than 15 % of the net lot area and lawfully existing before (ZTA Effective Date), is a conforming lot; however, the building coverage existing before (ZTA Effective Date) must not be increased.

#### Background

- 1. Section 59-H-9.3 of the Montgomery County Ordinance requires that, within thirty days of introduction of any text amendment, the Council act by resolution to set a date and time for public hearing on the proposed amendment.
- 2. Zoning Text Amendment No. 05-15, which would amend the Zoning Ordinance to establish a definition for the term "impervious surface"; revise building coverage standards as a percentage of net lot area for certain zones; establish maximum impervious surface standards as a percentage of net lot area for certain zones; require the submission of a site layout design under certain circumstances; grandfather certain lots from building coverage and impervious standards under certain circumstances; and generally amend building coverage and impervious surface standards, was introduced on October 3, 2005.
