Planning Department staff discussed the proposed changes to the Subdivision Staging Policy, formerly known as the Growth Policy, which are necessary to manage staging under the White Flint Sector Plan. Staff noted that all proposed changes will be part of a new "alternative review procedure" that would apply to all new development within the White Flint Policy Area. Staff has met with several stakeholders to discuss the proposed changes and has distributed a red-line document to the Board that reflects the consensus reached with the stakeholders. Staff added that the proposed amendments are scheduled to be approved by the Planning Board at the March 3 meeting for transmittal to the County Council.

In keeping with the February 17 technical staff report, Planning Department staff offered a multi-media presentation of the Wheaton Central Business District (CBD) and Vicinity Sector Plan. Staff noted that this is a continuation of the discussion on land use and zoning – districts and parcel specific issues, and urban design guidelines started last Thursday. Staff discussed the Kensington View/Wheaton Hills Block S, the Lindsay Property along East Avenue and noted that the proposal is to retain the R-60 zone for lots 12 and 13 and the CRN zone for lots 7, 9, 10, and 11. Staff also added that the community requested that the current R-6 and C-T zones be retained as well.

The following speakers offered testimony: Ms. Anne Marie Vassallo, attorney from Shulman Rogers; Chris Lindsay, owner of Lindsay Ford on Veirs Mill Road; Ms. Judy Higgins of Midvale Road and representing the Kensington View Civic Association; Ms. Virginia Sheard of Geiger Avenue; Mr. Jody Kline, attorney from Miller, Miller, and Canby; Ms. Diane Lynne of Glenhaven Place and President of the Wheaton Forest Civic Association; Mr. Jim Agliata and Ms. Elsie Reid representing Westfield Shopping Mall; and Ms. Donna Savage of McComas Court and representing the Kensington Heights Civic Association Land use Committee.

At the Board's request, Mr. Robert Kline, representing the County Executive's office, offered comments.

There followed extensive Board discussion of several issues related to the urban design guidelines being part of the Sector Plan or part of an independent report to allow flexibility.

Commissioner Dreyfuss noted that staff may get a better plan by having the urban design guidelines done as a separate report, which will not require amendment to the Sector Plan or the Master Planl.
