

APPROVED MINUTES

The Montgomery County Planning Board met in regular session on Thursday, May 24, 2012, at 10:01 a.m. in the Montgomery Regional Office in Silver Spring, Maryland, and adjourned at 5:15 p.m.

Present were Chair Françoise M. Carrier, Vice Chair Marye Wells-Harley, and Commissioners Casey Anderson and Norman Dreyfuss. Commissioner Amy Presley was necessarily absent.

Prior to the meeting, the Board participated with the members of the Prince George's County Planning Board, via conference call, in a Closed Session meeting of The Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission (M-NCPPC) in the third floor conference room, which was convened at 9:19 a.m. and adjourned at 9:49 a.m., followed by an open session meeting, which was adjourned at 9:53 a.m. The official citation and open session report of the Closed Session meeting and the report of open session actions are included in the M-NCPPC minutes.

Items 1 through 4 are reported on the attached agenda. Item 5 was postponed.

The Board recessed at 12:43 p.m. for lunch, to take up Item 6 in Closed Session, and to meet with a Planning Department writing consultant.

The Board convened in Closed Session at 1:16 p.m. in the third floor conference room, on motion of Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Vice Chair Wells-Harley, with Chair Carrier, Vice Chair Wells-Harley, and Commissioners Anderson and Dreyfuss present and voting in favor of the motion, and with Commissioner Presley absent. The meeting was closed under authority of Annotated Code of Maryland, State Government Article, §10-508(a)(3), to consider the acquisition of real property for a Commission purpose and matters directly related thereto.

Also present for all or part of the Closed Session were Associate General Counsel Derrick Rogers of the Legal Department; Director Mary Bradford, Deputy Directors Gene Giddens and Mike Riley, Bill Gries, and April O'Neale of the Parks Department; and Ellyn Dye of the Commissioners' Office.

In a separate item, the Board received advice of counsel and consulted former Planning Board Chairman Royce Hanson on issues related to the Clarksburg Town Center, including violations, the plan of compliance, the certified site plan, and obligations for infrastructure.

Ms. Bradford also noted that the Montgomery Park Police Mounted Unit assisted with security at the recent G-8 Summit at Camp David, and she thanked the 245 volunteers from Marriott Corporation who participated in the 10th annual "Spirit to Serve Day" park cleanup activities.
