RECOMMENDATION

Approval for the three cases in the attached packet. Transmit recommendations to the County Executive for final action.

DISCUSSION

This staff package contains recommendations for category changes requiring action by the County Executive (CE). Administrative cases are generally well within established policies and guidelines for community water and sewer service and therefore do not go before the County Council for action. The Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) staff has submitted the attached package of category change requests on behalf of the CE.

The staff report for administrative cases only highlight those cases where recommendations differ from the Executive's recommendation, or where significant comments should be brought to the attention of the Board. There are no differences between agency recommendations in this package.

CONCLUSION

Planning staff's comments on all cases have been incorporated into DEP's packet along with the comments of other agencies. The full packet for administrative hearing is attached for your consideration or further comment.

If the Planning Board believes that any of these cases requires County Council action, such action should be requested at this time.

The Department of Environmental Protection held a public hearing on July 23, 2008 at 2:30 pm. The Board's recommendations will be transmitted to the Executive during the period of open record. The County Executive will take final action on the category change requests.

M-NCPPC: County Master Plan Consistency Statement:*

The 2006 Damascus Master Plan states that properties zoned for one- and two-acre development can be considered for community water service if provision of service resolves drinking water quality issues, improves fire safety or is economically feasible. The availability of community water service from existing lines abutting the propertystrongly indicates economic feasibility. This request is consistent with the plan.

Water and Sewer Category Recommendation:

Approval

WSSC: Property abuts a water main and can be served by connections.

DPS: We support the availability of public water to this property; this will facilitate future septic system repairs and replace a well that does not meet current standards.

DEP Staff Recommendation and Report: Approve S-1. Policy V.F.1.a Consistent with Existing Plans. The provision of public sewer service is consistent with County Water and Sewer Plan policies and with master plan service recommendations. The property abuts existing sewer lines.

Agency Review Comments

M-NCPPC: County Master Plan Consistency Statement:*

The 2006 Damascus Master Plan states that properties zoned for one- and two-acre development can be considered for community water service if provision of service resolves drinking water quality issues, improves fire safety or is economically feasible. The availability of community water service from existing lines abutting the propertystrongly indicates economic feasibility. This request is also designed to alleviate a public health problem, in this case a failing well. This request is consistent with the plan.

Water and Sewer Category Recommendation:

Approval

WSSC: Property abuts a water main and can be served by connections.

DPS: Our inspector's findings in February 2008 indicate the well is of substandard construction, going dry and there are water quality concerns due to the presence of a buried fuel tank on the property.

DEP Staff Recommendation and Report: Approve S-1. Policy V.F.1.a Consistent with Existing Plans. The provision of public sewer service is consistent with County Water and Sewer Plan policies and with master plan service recommendations.

DEP NOTE: The property has also experienced public health problems. The extension of public water service to this property to relieve a failed well system is authorized under the Water and Sewer Plan's policies addressing public health problems for individual properties. DEP sent on April 2, 2008 a notice to WSSC to expedite service.

Agency Review Comments

M-NCPPC: Our staff have no objection to a multi-use system on the elementary school on Turkey Foot Road.

WSSC: A 9000-foot-long non-CIP-sized sewer extension is required to serve the property. This extension would connect to the Muddy Branch Trunk Sewer (contract no. 73-5718A) and would abut many properties in addition to the applicant's. Rights-of-way would be required. Construction of this extension would involve the removal of trees, would temporarily impact wetlands, and would require construction within MNCPPC property.

DPS: 'Water table' and percolation testing was conducted on the property in March, 2008, to establish sufficient septic area to install at least one replacement septic system so that the existing drywells could be replaced and properly abandoned. DPS met with the designer, MCPS and MDE in May, 2008, to discuss the plans for septic system replacement and all associated County and State requirements and permits.

DEP Staff Recommendation and Report: Approve Replacement Multi-use Septic System. Approval for multi-use sewerage systems under W-1 and S-6. Policy V.F.2.d, Larger-capacity multi-use systems. Darenstown Elementary school has been functioning on a small capacity multi-use system that has been inspected and shows to be failing. The Montgomery County Public Schools would like to replace the system with a large-capacity multi-use system. The existing multi-use system was never identified and DEP will amend plan text to include this multi-use system in its inventory. The school system is working the well and septic section with this replacement system.

*DEP NOTE: Darnestown Elementary School is not seeking public sewer service. The comments WSSC provided demonstrate the extensive efforts that would be involved to do so.

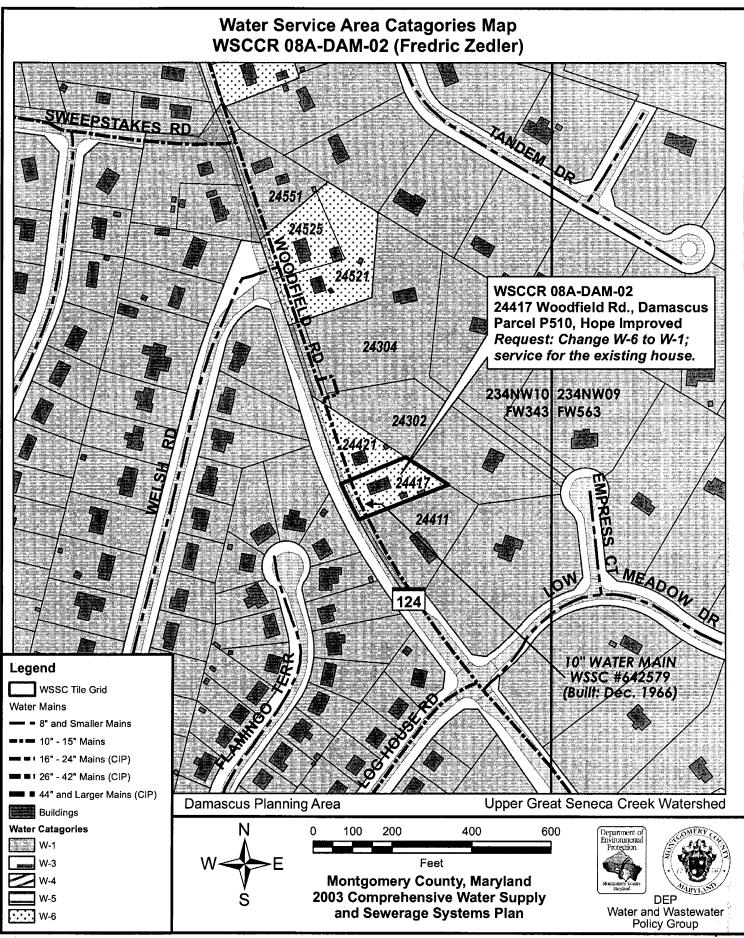

The Department of Permitting Services (DPS), Well and Septic Section, has advised this office of a public health problem, a well failure, at the subject property (see the attached memorandum). DPS recommended relief of this problem by connecting the site to public water service, due to in part to the presence of an abutting 10"-dia. water main (WSSC #693963A).

Although this property is designated as category W-6 in the County's Water and Sewer Plan, DPS acknowledgement of a public health problem is sufficient justification to warrant the expedited provision of public water service, regardless of the existing service area category. DEP has initiated the process to have the property owner file a request for a service area change from W-6 to W-1 (WSCCR 08A-DAM-03).

Given these conditions, it is reasonable to relieve this public health hazard by expediting the provision of public water service. WSSC should not wait for the approval of a Water and Sewer Plan amendment to provide public service; public water service via the WSSC's system should be provided as soon as possible. We would appreciate your assistance in this matter.
