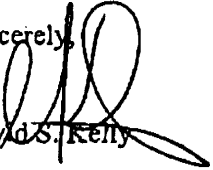
Dear Ms Wright:

Dear Ms. Cavicchi: as a resident of the Green Acres neighborhood, I've been invited to write to you in support of the proposal to preserve the subject house and its associated historical and geographical features. As an adjacent property owner (of the property bordering the SW corner of the former Riviere parcel), I understand that the original structure of my own house--built in 1860 or 1870--is also part of the early history of this portion of Montgomery County. I would like to touch on two points: the quality of this neighborhood's support for saving the Sara L. Brown house, and the role this preservation might play in the ongoing life of this neighborhood.

When I first saw the surveyor's plat plan for the proposed subdivision, my heart sank: it was obvious that the required acreage for four new houses was there, so I assumed that the loss of the Brown house was a fait accompli. It has been quite amazing to see the spontaneous expression of neighborhood support for saving the house--not for antidevelopment reasons but rather for the preservation of a unique portion of the County's early history. Before I had any notion that such preservation was a possibility, I had both familiar neighbors and perfect strangers knocking on my door to ask what I knew and what they could do to help. Each one of these, and each of the other neighbors I've spoken with, has emphasized their enjoyment of this small corner of mid-19th to early 20th century architecture, geography, and relatively uncrowded atmosphere. And each one has noted that having even a small remnant of the past in their environs has helped them endure in the hectic, crowded lives they and all of us live these days.

Secondly, I wish to add my point of view as a social anthropologist. One of my areas of professional interest has been neighborhoods--what binds them together as healthy units, and what tends to tear them apart. Many of us have felt that this neighborhood has approached a 'tipping point' where further development density and vehicular traffic would spoil its heretofore quiet, safe, unpretentious, friendly, family- and school-focused atmosphere. I hope it will be possible to preserve this unique portion of the neighborhood and, over time, to document what such historic properties and areas--even in the midst of inevitable upgrading and new development--can add to the character and life of a neighborhood.

I have read David Scribner's submission with interest and admiration. I want to register my support for his efforts--both toward historical preservation and toward greater neighborhood coherence and collaboration. Especially since 9/11/2001, we have all been hearing how vital the collective, neighborhood dimension of our lives is--or needs to be. It seems to me that this effort is a demonstration of that central human value.

I live at the end of Allandale Road next door to the Loughborough (Milton) house and very close to the Sara Brown House. I have lived in this neighborhood for 32 years and have enjoyed the quiet streets, neighbors, and the history of the area. The Loughborough House has been a source of pleasure for many in the neighborhood, and I strongly feel that the Sara Brown House should be a part of that also. It is my understanding that the Sara Brown House is a prime example of the "Swedish gambrel-roofed" houses that were built early in the history of the State of Maryland and Montgomery County. In addition, it was a part of the original Loughborough tract and was built for a granddaughter as a wedding present. Preservation of such history is an important community function and helps to maintain the integrity of a neighborhood, in addition to serving as a model of historic architectural style. Maintaining the grounds and the serenity of the area as an historic structure is key to continuing the thread of the history of the State, the County and the neighborhood.

I advocate preservation of the Brown House instead of the current proposal for maximum development of the property.

Please convey my concerns to the other members of the Evaluation Committee as they discuss the preservation of the Sara Brown House. I plan to attend the Evaluation Hearing on 9/24 to support the preservation of this house and to oppose any plan for its demolition.

Dear Ms. Cavicchi,

This letter is written in support of putting the old Loughborough/Brown House at 5004 River Road, Bethesda, MD 20816 on the list of houses designated for historic preservation. The house is closely connected to the old Loughborough Place on Allandale Road, Bethesda, MD (in view from my house in the same Greenacres subdivision) and forms an integral part of the history of the old Loughborough Place and Maryland's history as well as the history of this County. Although the house currently requires some restoration, it is a very rare example in the County of the Swedish-gambrel roofed houses that were built as part of the earliest wave of the Colonial Revival tradition. Thus from a historic and architectural perspective, this house should be saved from being destroyed in favor of 4 new modern houses which additionally and most certainly would bring with it the destruction of the lovely old trees on the property ; we already have enough modern developments in the County and need to treasure the heritage left for us to cherish rather than to erase. The house most certainly can be restored and preserved to form a lovely residence again for owners who appreciate its historical and architectural significance.

Thus I urge you as a long-time resident of this community to preserve the Loughboro/Brown House as a reminder of Maryland's history for the next generations to come. Otherwise, precious little will be left for them to learn from and remind them of Maryland's important history.
